2.0 OPENING PRAYER

The opening prayer was said by Pastor Chibuikem Evans at 1:25pm.

3.0 EXHORTATION

The Exhortation was taken by the District Overseer was taken from the book of **Haggai 1:1-7**, with the topic: **“Consider your ways”**. This book was written to Zerubbabel and the children of Israel, the main reason for the book was calling back the children of Israel that first returned from desolation they have been called back to God and to take God’s matter as priority,

Haggi told them to consider their ways. He encouraged members and worshippers to also consider their ways. He encouraged everyone to always put God first in all they do (**Matthew 6:33**) - whether things are smooth or difficult.

The children of Israel and Zerubbabel responded in obedience. We should know that the word of God is meant to make us turn to God and do the mind of God. **(Deuteronomy 28:1-24, Job 36:11)**. We will see that obedience is key. Also note that we can only respond in obedience when we open our ears.

The relationship the father has with a son is that they should relate well. Every child must listen to his father. The District Overseer prayed that we will not miss our packaged blessing in Jesus' name. Everyone was encouraged to always open our hearts to hear what God is saying to us.

4.0 CONSIDERATION AND ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES OF THE 2025 ANNUAL GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

A quorum was formed after recording an attendance of 155 people.

- Pastor Mrs. Rufus noted that her name was not on the attendant sheet.
- Bro. Zacheus moved the motion for the Adoption of the Minutes which was seconded by Pastor Mrs. Grace David.
- The Senior Pastor's report was read where members were appreciated for their unusual and unfailing support for the growth of the church.
- Reports were taken as read.
- Bro Fakulude presented the financial report. He reported that income increased by 28.7%, Tithes 29%, Worship offering 67%, Building 122.3%, others 18.4%, surplus 48%, Excess of income over Expenditure.
- Motion for Adoption of Reports for discussions was moved by Rev Bamidele Oke and seconded by Daddy Sanni

5.0 MATTERS ARISING

5.0.1 Issues Discussed

- Brother Zacheus asked for clarification on the report; he noted that all subgroups had different forms of reporting instead of sticking to the same format.
- A member asked if there were ways each group could recruit their members to reduce the group's challenges.
- A member noted that the church would have done better, but congested activities of the church affected the turn up of members at time. He asked if the church program could come up early enough, so that it could be taken care of.

5.0.2 Appreciation

- Pastor Evans appreciated all the internal service unit. He noted that some of the other churches reports were not submitted e.g. Hausa church, Otitokoro, Abanishe and Restoration.

5.0.3 Yearly Appraisal

- Brother Abraham asked what could be done to improve the yearly appraisal
- **Security men:** It was noted that the church parking space was been used by our neighbor for their packing their clients' cars during parties. He asked what the church was doing about it.
- It was also noted that Teens were not attending Bible studies and Prayer meetings. He stated that this was not encouraging.

5.0.4 Time Management

- Bro. Arukwe advised the church leaders to look at our time series. He noted that many leaders do not keep time allotted to them most of the time, and they really need to look into it. He also advised that public holidays' activities should be replanned to have adequate rest.

5.0.5 Weekly Activities

- Sis. Ngozi Nwosu agreed that teenagers should be part of the church's weekly activities and suggested that their parents' phone numbers could be collected to send them reminders.

5.0.6 Sunday School Attendance

- Sis. Okoro reported that Sunday school attendance was not encouraging, it was low. She stated that it was through Sunday school that people could be disciplined for the Lord. She urged teachers to note if is any declined in attendance so that such members would be called for questioning.

5.0.7 Marriage Counselling

- Rev. Mrs Obende advised that all the departmental leaders should be involved in marriage counseling and not leave it for just the marriage committee alone noting that departmental heads too could guide especially the young ones on marriage issues. She also suggested that the Next-Gen should be encouraged to attend bible college, even if it is online course. She urged the authorities to look into it.

5.0.8 Church Chairs

- It noted that some of the church chairs were bad and packed outside without any usefulness. One of the chairs tore a man's shirt. A member suggested that the chairs should be disposed to empty space occupied by the chairs.

5.0.9 Rails

- Evangelist Jackson suggested that the rails should be completed to avoid emergency cases.

5.0.10 Counselling Office

The issue of Pastor's office was discussed. It was advised that a conducive space be provided for him ASAP.

6.0 A. O. B

6.0.1

Iyanuoluwa church public system was reportedly having issues. Their generating set was also reportedly faulty, and the rain had blown off their roofs. This could discourage new members from coming back.

6.0.2

Sis. Alonge reported that only one bulb was working in the children's church and most of the fans were not working, especially the one in their office. She was equally informed that the speaker in the children's church had been moved away and she was sure if it was lost or not.

6.0.3

Pastor Evans that no sound equipment was taken away and that the current speaker there, is for the adult church. He promised to take care of the children's public system soon. Brother Ezekiel has already bought eleven bulbs and three fans, which will be fixed by next week.

6.0.3 Responses

The District Overseer appreciated everyone for their support during the year under Review. He prayed that none would lose their reward. He said daughter churches do not submit their reports on time, and that was not encouraging. He informed the house that there may be changes, now that they have new leaders under the new district.

7.0 ELECTIONS INTO THE CHURCH COUNCIL

The election into the church council was conducted. Deacon Adelowo was the chairman of the electoral committee. The District Overseer said the outgoing council members would still attend three more council meetings before finally leaving.

I like to specially welcome the good people of Egbe church to the 46th edition of the AGMM of this glorious assembly of God's people in the name of God the Father; Son and the Holy Ghost. Thank God for another opportunity to gather to appreciate the goodness and mercies of God over each and every one of us in the past one year. Although, it has not been an easy year, but the Almighty God whom we serve has remained the faithful God He is. He has been our rock, fortress, deliverer; strength, trust, buckler, the horn of our salvation, and high tower; our hope and comfort against the overwhelming and running flood having promised to make an utter end against them all. Join me in shouting forty-six (46) thunderous Hallelujahs to the one who is and who was and who to come. May His glorious name forever be praised forever in the mighty name of Jesus.

Permit me to start my address by paying glowing tributes to some of our departed colleagues who answered the ultimate call during the year under review. You will recall that we lost Sis Folusho Teleola Susan Moboluwaduro and our Bro Kayode Adeosun in the months of March and June 2026 respectively. May their souls rest in perfect peace in the mighty name of Jesus. We will miss them, but Christ knows better. It is also worthy of note that some of us lost our very close relatives too. We commiserate with you and pray that affliction will not rise again a second time in the mighty name of Jesus. Let it be noted that, just as we gather today to examine the report of our stewardship in the last one year, we must all realize that we will one day gather to give account of our stewardship to the Supreme Judge of the universe at the end of time. Church membership has a whole lot of privileges and responsibilities including regular attendance, financial support and contributions, fellowship, and serving others. We are to actively participate in church activities, strive to live according to Christian principles, and contribute to the overall spiritual growth of our community. Furthermore, church members are responsible for upholding the church's teachings and evangelizing by sharing their faith with others. While some of us have done tremendously well, many of us need to wake up and become more passionate about serving the Lord.

As a church, a lot was achieved in the year under review, and I pray this will continue in the new church. Egbe church has also continued to grow in most spiritual and financial parameters despite the daunting challenges we were confronted with, in the year under review. It is worthy of note that while the pre-Sunday worship service increased by 13.5% from 156 to 177, Sunday schools attendance grew by about 10.5% from 229 to 253 and Worship service by 9.04% from 365 to 398 largely as

result of contributions from our newly planted church at Orile-Imo, our Midweek Bible study and Prayer meetings both dropped from 133 to 112 (15.8%) and 230 to 196 (14.8%) respectively. We thank God for our Mid-month Revival Meetings which have continued to be a time of tremendous blessings and impartation of God's people and we want to use this opportunity to appreciate everyone who has allowed the Lord to use them as an instrument in His hands. We appeal to those who have refused to attend our Midweek service to please have a change of heart.

In the area of finance, our total income increased by 8.2% from a total of N58.92m to N63.73m in the year under review. For the very first time, total tithe dropped by 6.3% from N38.58m to N36.16m. This can either be attributed to the biting economic situation of the country and members not fully fulfilling their obligations in this respect. Again, we appeal for a change of heart so we can be made candidates of His blessings. Worthy of mention is our birthday celebrations thanksgiving offering which increased by a whopping 68.97% from N6.96m to N11.76m in the year under review. Special thanks go to everyone who have been faithful in propagating the gospel, soul winning and giving of their substance especially in the area of prompt payment of tithes to the Lord. I know the God who never owns anyone will not disappoint you in the mighty name of Jesus.

For the 2026/27 church year, we will continue to build on our vision of building a heavenly focused church by exalting God, edifying the people and evangelizing the lost by continuously aligning ourselves with the vision of the decade of soaring under our father in the Lord, Rev (Dr.) Sam Aboyeji which seeks to conscientiously focus on the expansion of our work through outreach; empowering our labor force through in-reach and making provision for inclusiveness of the NEXT-GEN. Our basic objective will be to continue to build a church and people of excellence and power who will take the message of salvation to lost souls in Egbe and its environs. We will continue to encourage our leaders to steadfastly carry out their responsibility of soul winning, discipleship and giving so we can grow the church to worship service attendance of 600 worshipers with a target income of N100m only for the year 2026/27 church year. To achieve all this, we appeal for greater faithfulness in paying our tithes, giving for missions and birthday contribution for the church building which has seen tremendous improvement in the year under review. We also appeal to our leaders to ensure full participation in our services, especially our midweek services, to set the required example for upcoming and new members.

We will also ensure that work on the church building commences in the New Church year and work towards completion and dedication of the building. We are also looking at the possibility of always getting the church open for prayers and counselling amongst others. We also want to shift our focus and attention to the Teens and Children as the future of the church. You will agree with me that we have a number

of gifted young men and women in our midst, and we need to assist them to achieve their God given potential to the fullest.

As I bring this report to a close, permit me to request that we continue to pray for the work of God in our hands and the nation generally that the Almighty God whom we serve will intervene especially in a time like this. Things are not really getting better, and the disconnect between the leaders and citizens of the country is alarming. Insecurity is on the rise, and the economic challenges confronting people are becoming more and more alarming. We must continue to ask for God's intervention. He has done it in time past and will do it again. Let us pray that God will ward off every spirit of division in our midst and ensure that we remain focused on our ultimate objective of making heaven by living our lives to please God in all that we do in the mighty name of Jesus. This is our season of New Things and Passionate Kingdom Service, and I know you and your family will not be left out as we continue to play our part in the mighty name of Jesus.

On a final note, I like to appreciate the tremendous support and understanding that I have continued to enjoy from my reliable companion and wife, Olufunke and my children. It has not been easy, but they have actually continued to make this work easy for me by their actions and conduct, and I like to say I am grateful. I am equally indebted to all our leaders and workers for their assistance, gifts, and encouragement in this work. I appreciate all the pastors, church council members, leaders, members, and worshippers of this great assembly for their sacrifice, cooperation, and understanding. May the Lord continue to bless you all for your labor of love. I appeal to all to please follow us as we lead by the Spirit of God. Offer your support by your presence in various programs and meetings, evangelism and invitation of friends and relations to the church and also ensure that you are faithful in all ramifications. You are blessed. Do remain rapturable. Maranatha.

Here are the needs: 3 tippers of Red Sand at ~~N~~110,000 each, blocks about 400 pieces, cement 15 bags, gravel one tipper load, WC 3, and roofing sheets and wood, and plaster sand one tipper.

The event fulfilled Goal 4 (Zonal Brotherhood & Collaboration) and helped deepen the sense of shared identity and purpose across the zone.

CHALLENGES DURING THE 2025/2026 CHURCH YEAR

The following challenges were encountered during the year and are noted to inform planning for the year ahead:

Challenge 1 — Attendance Consistency

Sustaining consistent attendance at bi-weekly prayer meetings and EXCO sessions remained difficult, particularly during work and school periods. Some members found it challenging to commit to both Tuesday and Thursday slots.

Challenge 2 — Dues Collection

Despite a clear dues structure of ₦1,000 per month, collection was not optimal. A significant number of members were in arrears for parts of the year, limiting the council's financial base for spontaneous welfare and program needs.

Challenge 3 — Program Coordination Lead Time

Several major programs were planned and finalized close to their dates, limiting the time available for adequate publicity, logistics, and member preparation. This affected attendance and mobilization at some events.

Challenge 4 — Member Engagement Between Programs

Outside of scheduled programs and prayer meetings, general engagement and communication among members was irregular. There was no structured mid-year touchpoint to assess progress, re-energize members, or celebrate wins.

Challenge 5 — Speaker and Minister Availability

Confirming external guest ministers and speakers within desired timelines was sometimes challenging, requiring last-minute adjustments to program plans.

PLANS & GOALS FOR 2026/2027 CHURCH YEAR

Building on the achievements and lessons of 2025/2026, the council sets the following goals and plans for the year July 2026 to June 2027:

Goal 1 — Deepen Spiritual Formation

Objective

Maintain the CFM Wake-Up Call prayer meetings and introduce at least one quarterly fasting and prayer challenge to build individual and corporate spiritual discipline across all members.

Key Actions

- Continue bi-weekly Wake-Up Call on Tuesdays and Thursdays
- Introduce quarterly 3-day fasting challenges with shared devotional materials
- Hold the annual Men's Revival Week in the first half of 2027

Goal 2 — Strengthen Men's Empowerment & Capacity Building

Objective

Hold the District Men's Empowerment Program earlier in the year (Q1 or Q2) to allow more time for planning, publicity, and member preparation. Introduce a practical post-program follow-up to ensure skills learned are applied.

Key Actions

- Plan the 2027 Empowerment Program for no later than March 2027
- Introduce a post-program accountability group or WhatsApp sub-group
- Consider a mini skill-share session mid-year for CFM members

Goal 3 — Grow and Retain Active Membership

Objective

Improve active participation by introducing a structured membership drive, a mentorship arrangement for younger men in the council, and a mid-year review meeting to re-engage members.

Key Actions

- Conduct a membership audit in July 2026 to identify active vs inactive members
- Launch a men's mentorship or discipleship sub-group pairing older and younger members
- Hold a mid-year (December/January) review and fellowship gathering

Goal 4 — Improve Financial Health & Dues Compliance

Objective

Achieve at least 80% dues compliance across active members by implementing monthly reminders, transparent reporting, and a modest incentive for consistent members.

Key Actions

- Issue monthly dues reminders via WhatsApp with running payment status

- Publish a quarterly financial update to EXCO and members
- Establish a dedicated welfare fund from a portion of annual dues collection

Goal 5 — Sustain Family & Church Impact

Objective

Continue to organize the Father's Day Sunday Service and explore at least one additional family-focused engagement during the year, such as a marriage retreat, couples' fellowship, or parenting forum in collaboration with the women's fellowship.

Key Actions

- Begin planning Father's Day 2027 no later than April 2027
- Explore a joint program with CWF (Council of Foursquare Women) on marriage and family
- Identify and sponsor at least two men from the council for external leadership or ministry training

Goal 6 — Strengthen Welfare Response

Objective

Build a formal welfare response structure so that we support members in need — including bereavement, illness, and hardship — coordinated, prompt, and adequately funded.

Key Actions

- Establish a CFM Welfare Fund with a defined minimum balance target
- Assign a welfare officer within EXCO with clear response protocols
- Review welfare policy annually at the start of each program year

CONCLUSION
